# **Course Description**

The instructor has designed this course first and foremost with the intention of providing her students with a basic understanding of the themes and events that dominated the American past since the Civil War. For obvious reasons, she has not designed the course to be in anyway comprehensive, but rather foundational. It is a course from which further exploration of this nation's history may be launched. In addition to providing students with a broad knowledge of US History, the course will help students critically analyze historical events. The course design also includes interpretive techniques to help students better understand what it is that historians do.

- \*The essay must be typed, in 12-point font, Times New Roman, and be double-spaced. The margins should be 1 inch on the top and bottom and 1.25 on the left and right.
- \*Submit your movie assignment via D2L. On our D2L class dashboard, click on
- "Assessments." Then click on "Assignments." You should see a folder entitled "Bonnie & Clyde." You must upload your essay on the scheduled due date.

#### **Extra Credit**

\*No extra credit assignments will be accepted, but bonus points may be offered for attending instructor-specified events on campus.
