Course Description: This course focuses on the fundamentals of playing piano in the jazz idiom.

Course Objectives:

Students taking this course will focus on learning appropriate jazz chords and voicings, including two-handed comping, reading jazz piano music, improvisation, and learning of the various styles of jazz, including but not limited to the blues, modal jazz, bebop, and Latin jazz styles.

Grading for this course is based on attendance and preparation for lessons.
