Senior Capstone – Art 4923 M/W, 9:00-12:20 AM, Spring 2024

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Course Description

The goal of this course is to emphasize the creation and evolution of a conceptually strong and technically skillful body of work, ultimately resulting in the final BFA degree exhibition. Student builds upon previous coursework and prepares them to enter the field as an artist or an art educator. This course emphasizes expected professional standards and practices. Required for BFA and BFA Teacher Certification degree programs.

Course Objectives -

- Prepare the student to enter the workforce as an art professional.
- Supports the student in the production and exhibition of a cohesive body of work.
- Students will produce a résumé
- Students will produce a curriculum vitae (CV).
- Students will produce an artist biography.
- Students will produce an artist statement.
- Students will produce documents related to the promotion of their exhibition
- Students will design a website describing, documenting, and promoting their work.
- Students will org produce an exhibition of a cohesive body of their work.
- Students will present a PowerPoint presentation of their work to the art faculty.

- There will be a final grade deduction of one letter grade for each unexcused absence on any day the class meets for a group critique, or you are scheduled for an individual meeting with me. Being unprepared for a critique (arriving without work) or repeatedly arriving more than ten minutes late will also count as an absence at my discretion.
- A grade of "Incomplete" is granted only with a written doctor's excuse or under emergency circumstances such as a death in the family.
- Absences during critiques will not be tolerated. On critique days, a tardy will result in a reduction
 of one letter grade for the critique; a tardy of more than fifteen minutes or an absence will result
 in a zero for the critique. Please contact your professor prior to missing class. Lectures and
 demonstrations are not repeated.
