CMPS 5113 – Advanced Programming Language Concepts Fall 2022

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Course Objective: This course explores techniques for specifying the syntax and semantics of programming languages. Such language concepts as data structuring, information binding, control structures, execution environments, and extensibility are examined by studying scientific data processing, list processing, and multi-purpose languages.

Course Prerequisite: CMPS 2433 or concurrent enrollment.

Text: Programming Languages, Principles and Practice, 3th ed. By Louden & Lambert

Electronic Devices: The use of electronic devices is discouraged in this class. Students who intend to use a laptop or tablet should sit in the back row(s) of the class to avoid distracting other students.

Late Policy: Projects will be accepted late up to one week after the due date with a penalty of 5 points per day. If a project is submitted to D2L over the weekend, a hardcopy of the program should be submitted at the beginning of the next class. The D2L submission date will be the official date for calculating a late penalty. Late projects will not be accepted for a grade after one week from the due date. All assignments are due at the **beginning** of class on the due date. If you are late to class, your assignment will be counted late. Quizzes cannot be made up regardless of the reason the quiz was missed. One quiz grade will be dropped.

Academic Misconduct Policy & Procedures: Cheating, collusion, and plagiarism (the act of using source material of other persons, either published or unpublished, without following the accepted techniques of crediting and paraphrasing, or the submission for credit of work not the individuals to whom credit is given). The Department of Computer Science has adopted the following policy related to cheating (academic misconduct). The policy will be applied to all instances of cheating on assignments and exams as determined by the instructor of the course. (See below for link to MSU definitions.)

- 1st instance of cheating in a course: The student will be assigned a non-replaceable grade of zero for the assignment, project or exam. In addition, the student will receive a one letter grade reduction in course, if the grade doesn't result in a grade reduction.
- 2nd instance of cheating in a course: The student will receive a grade of F in course & immediately be removed from course.
- All instances of cheating will be reported to the Department Chair and, in the case of graduate students, to the Department Graduate Coordinator.

Note: Letting a student look at your work is collusion and is academic misconduct!
