APA 6th Edition is the manual for the writing style. Instead of buying it, you can find it free at the Purdue OWL online APA formatting and style guide online. Just Google it. (Purdue OWL APA online formatting and style guide)

Your examinations and exercises will come from this text.

I recommend you take the text and immediately read it like a novel in a couple of days. Breezing through the material will give you an idea of the authors plan for the material and make

it easier for you to prepare for the exercises and tests. The authors occasionally refer to material from previous or later chapters when designing the adult learning exercises (tests) and studying in this manner will prevent you from being surprised when asked to integrate material from throughout the text.

Your personal autobiography will be 5 % of your overall grade.

Eleven five question surveys will comprise 15 % of your grade. Think of them as mini quizzes.

Eleven twenty question quizzes will comprise 30 % of your grade.

The 8–12-page biography of a organized crime figure written in APA writing style will comprise 25% of your grade.

Discussions will be 25 % of your grade.

WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT:

- Each student should research and locate an organized crime figure 1900 to current date.
- You should quickly request permission for your subject (criminal) from the instructor so you can have your favorite bad guy to research.
- Find a source of a format for writing a biography for your gangster. The simplest way to do this is by searching in the search engines, www.msn.com, www.yahoo.com, www.google.com, www.ask.com, on "HOW DO I WRITE A BIOGRAPHY? You will find many results like; http://www.bham.wednet.edu/bio/biomak2.htm
- Choose the biography format that you think is most appropriate for this assignment, remember to list your source of format in your references and include a short explanation why you selected it and felt it was most appropriate for this assignment and your subject.

- Remember this research and choice of format is part of your grade, simple and fast is not always the fastest way to an A, just as lengthy and burdensome does not always score the best. Spend a little time and find a format that you think handles the topic in the most scholarly manner for this type of assignment.
- All papers should be submitted in MS-Word, spell and grammar checked in 12 point Arial font. Remember to take advantage of all of the rich formatting features in MS-Word, color, bold, italic, underline, indentation, bullets, to give emphasis to your major points, draw attention to your logic and lead the reader where you want them to go. Be sure and spend some time in the first sixty to eighty pages in the APA manual, that's the how to part of the book. The rest is just samples, read the first part of the manual at least twice before starting. Be sure and spell and grammar check your work, have someone else preview it for you. Pay attention to all of the details in APA, title page, running head, DoubleSpace narrative, in text citations and be sure and check the APA online for the latest formats for citing electronic documents and make sure all of your links work.
- Your research references should be peer reviewed criminal justice or other professional social science journals. Newspapers, popular magazines, news articles, web news, newspapers, house organs, in agency publications and textbooks are good for adding texture, color, taste, smell and feel to paper but they are not generally acceptable as good academic sources. Please use them wisely and judiciously in your paper, this also is a major source of your grade, your ability to get online in the library and find and access the rich resource of peer reviewed journals that are available for free in full text. If you have not done so, a short phone call to one of the librarians for assistance would be well worth your time.
