#### **Required Texts:**

Life Span Development in Context: A Topical Approach (2nd Edition) by Tara L. Kuther

#### **Course Objectives:**

After completing this course, you will have a greater understanding of:

- 1. The different stages of human development, from infancy to old age.
- 2. How Social, Emotional, and Cognitive factors change over the course of the lifespan.
- 3. The challenges that come with healthy aging as well as age-related disorders (e.g., Alzheimer's Disease, memory loss, etc.).

#### **Attendance:**

This course has been planned as a face-to-face course for Fall 2023. I will use D2L for posting syllabi, course communication, course schedule, attendance, and gradebook. You should regularly check D2L and the email hosted via D2L for important course information.

Class attendance is **required**. If you do miss class, you will be responsible for the material you missed when absent. No make-up exams will be given **except in the case of an emergency**, such as a serious illness, a serious accident, or a death in the family. *You must verify your emergency with documentation*. **You must contact me via email no later than 24 hours after the missed exam**. If you miss an exam without a valid excuse, you will receive a zero for the assignment. Students with more than four absences will be dropped from the course with a failing grade.

### **Course Requirements:**

- 1. **Exams:** Students will complete **four** exams during the semester. Each exam will be worth 100 points for a total of 400 points (~60% of your final grade).
- 2. Quizzes: Students will complete 14 quizzes throughout the semester (1 per chapter). Quizzes are administered online via D2L and are designed to help you prepare for the exams. Quizzes are open-note/open-book and are worth 10 points each. Your lowest quiz grade will be dropped. Thus, quizzes count 130 points towards your overall course grade (~ of your final grade 20%). \*Late quiz submissions will lose 10% of their point value per day they are late.\* This means that you have up to ten days after each quiz is due to submit for partial credit. \*You will not receive credit for submitting your quiz more than 10 days past the deadline, so please don't send me an email about it\*

3. Class participation: Students get the most out of their college experience when they show up to class and actively participate. To facilitate class participation, we will randomly complete activities and/or discussions in class. Your participation grade will be based on your \*participation in class discussions, general attendance, and completion of in-class activities\*. Participation is worth 70 points towards your final grade (~10% of your final grade)
