Utilize credible supporting sources in our essays according to MLA citing.

Demonstrate proficient use of Standard Written English.

D2L Moffett Librarian Ryan Samuelson's threads: 10% of semester grade (1 thread for a 60; 2 - 70; 3 -80; 4 - 90; 5 - 100; no thread means a "0"). NOTE: Ryan's threads require an answer to his question and a response to another student's thread. Therefore, if students do one without the other, they receive half the points (e.g., 55 instead of 60).

The PowerPoint is FOUR slides.

Slide 1: title slide - answer this prompt:

Slide 2: description paragraph & at least one image.

Slide 3: description paragraph & at least one image.

TWO of the description paragraphs must pertain to ONE of the two movies; ONE description paragraph pertains to the other (you choose which).

THREADS (two types – one is to answer Ryan's question, which is required; the other is optional: getting input from Dr. Fields on the student's writing before submitting it to the drop box): For Moffett Librarian Ryan Samuelson, students receive point value for answering his question with two or three sentences and responding with two or three sentences to another student's answer. This thread is REQUIRED. The LINK for Ryan's thread will be provided in a NEWS ITEM on our D2L course home page.

The SECOND type is optional: this thread is for **input from Dr. Fields** about the student's paragraph BEFORE the student submits it to the drop box on a due date. Go to CONTENT and click on either the module for **RSC Tempest & Forbidden Planet** OR the module for **Taymor's Tempest & Miyazaki's Kiki**. In the module, click on the arrow by the title of the **DISCUSSION FORUM FOR TOPIC AND THREAD**. Then click on VIEW TOPIC. Type into the textbox directly or copy and paste your paragraph. Then POST it. I will reply with suggestions. NOTE: My reply will not be in time if you wait until we are on top of the due date.

GRADES ARE NOT ROUNDED UP - D2L Final Calculated Grade is the semester grade.

Here are the numeric-letter values: 100-90 (A), 89-80 (B), 79-70 (C), 69-60 (D), 59-0 (F). NOTE: An 89.9 is a B; 79.9 is a C; 69.9 is a D; and 59.9 is an F.

Plagiarism

Any use of a non-documented source as if it were a student's original work is academic dishonesty. The grade will be a "0" (no points) for the assignment and the student can no longer attend the course. The course grade is F. The student will be removed with a WF.

Language too close to source

Students sometimes borrow the phrasing of the play or their scholarly sources as if it were their own. Students certainly can use key words from their sources, but they must use their own phrasing—not the source's.

Readability & Originality

The rubric has a category devoted to legibility and originality. Student writing must be readable and original. Students should NOT adapt material from either the instructor's models or the paragraphs other students submit in a THREAD.
