Course Description

Learners in this course will examine current theories of how people learn in online spaces that employ digital media and explore a range of online learning tools such as social networking media, Internet Communication Tools (ICT), productivity applications, and wikis. Students will develop learning experiences with these digital media.

Textbook & Instructional Materials

No textbook is required. The research will be conducted for assignments. All students must have Internet access and a computer.

Instructor Drop

An instructor may drop a student any time during the semester for excessive absences, consistently failing to meet class assignments, an indifferent attitude, or disruptive conduct. The instructor must give the student a verbal or written warning before dropping the student from the class. An instructor's drop of a student takes precedence over the student-initiated course drop at a later date. The instructor will assign a grade of either WF or F through the first 8 weeks of a long semester, the first 6 weeks of a 10-week summer term, or the 11th class day of a 4 or 5-week summer term consisting of 20 days. After these periods the grade will be an F. The date the instructor drop form is received in the Office of the Registrar is the official drop date.

Therefore, all written assignments will have 10% -20% of the grade based on spelling and grammar. Expectations are for quality work.

The new Constitutional Carry law does not change this process. Concealed carry still requires a License to Carry permit, and openly carrying handguns is not allowed on college campuses.
