TEACHING RESPONSIBILITIES

Midwestern State University

Associate Professor, Appreciation of Film. A course designed to introduce students to the study of film and its relationship to society, culture, and technology. Students learn to explore film from a number of perspectives with form, culture and representation framing the main topics of the course. Towards that end, the class introduces and highlights a wide variety of issues related to the study of film: production, distribution, criticism, genre, auteur theory, realism and formalism.

Fall 2015 – Present

Associate Professor, Foundations in Media Production. Hands-on workshops and lectures introduce students to the concepts and technical skills required for multimedia production. Students examine the interactions between audio, visual design, video, broadcasting, photography and journalism. Through a series of writing and media projects, students gain a foundation of technical skills that prepares them for more advanced production coursework.

Fall 2015 – Present

<u>Associate Professor</u>, Field and Studio Production. An intermediate field and studio television production course featuring planning, producing, and skill development for basic video production. Students are exposed to the terminology, equipment, roles and situations of the television production process.

Fall 2015 - Present

Associate Professor, Media Management. This class is designed to give the students an understanding of the financial, legal, ethical and technical aspects of handling electronic and digital media in the 21st Century. Through this course students learn the principles of management, management needs, and characteristics of leadership in the broadcast, cable, telecommunication, and Internet industries. Upon completion of this course students are able to demonstrate, through class discussions, projects, and exams, an enriched understanding of the organizational and economic structures of the major electronic media industries.

Fall 2015 – Present

Associate Professor, Senior Documentary Production. This course introduces students to the art of documentary filmmaking. As a capstone course, it synthesizes the knowledge they've gained throughout their time in the Mass Communication program. Each student works with a group to create a 12 -15 minute short form documentary. This project will utilize preproduction research, proposal writing, interviews, lighting, observational footage, and editing skills.

Spring 2016 – Present

Associate Professor, Advanced Media Production I, II, III. This course is basis for the MNG Media team. It is an advanced media production course inside this framework as well. The students of this course operate as a full media production team under the lead student producer and executive producer. Students will learn advanced production techniques, media polishing skills, and new storytelling modes. Students are given weekly individual and group assignments that reflect a variety of technical and storytelling skills.

Fall 2015 - Present

Stephen F. Austin State University

<u>Lecturer</u>, Single Camera Production. A writing and production course that teaches film styles, documentary production, investigative research, and on location multimedia field production. Students develop projects using a variety of storytelling methods and research tools. This course has students developing investigative pieces that are published on multiple platforms.

<u>Lecturer</u>, Multimedia Production. Taught the programs and skills involved in graphic design, layout, audio/video production, and web design using InDesign, Audition, Final Cut X, and Photoshop. Taught the layout, terminology, and operation of a television production facility, lighting equipment, studio equipment, video recording & editing, studio cameras and other tools associated with studio productions. Every student produced a half hour program from the conceptualization stage through scripting, storyboards, production and post-production editing/packaging. August 2014 – December 2014
