Course Description

Learners will continue their study of current and emergent theories of how people learn in online spaces that employ digital media and explore a range of digital media designed to help the user create interactive and visual learning experiences. Students will explore and use virtual worlds, augmented reality, video and audio creation tools, and educational gaming tools to create learning experiences.

Course Objectives

- Students apply principles of visual and graphic design to create engaging learning experiences
- Students create, design, and implement multimedia learning environments
- Students can effectively find and use multimedia to create learning experiences for a variety of learning contexts

Instructor Drop

An instructor may drop a student any time during the semester for excessive absences, for consistently failing to meet class assignments, for an indifferent attitude, or disruptive conduct. The instructor must give the student a verbal or written warning before dropping the student from the class. An instructor's drop of a student takes precedence over the student-initiated course drop at a later date.
