**Course Description:** Introduction to algebraic structures, including groups, group isomorphisms, homomorphisms, direct products, and introduction to rings.

**Material covered:** We will cover chapters 1-6 and various sections from 9,10,11,14,16. Remaining material will be chosen by the class.

**Exams:** There will be 3 exams during the semester, each covering the material previously presented in class. Each exam will be worth 100 points. Each exam will be announced at least a week ahead of time.

**Homework:** During the semester there will be several assignments. Most of the assignments will be due at the beginning of the next class. It is expected that you do your work, copying proofs from others or finding solutions on the internet is an act of academic dishonesty and will be dealt with severely. All of these assignments will constitute 100 points in your final grade calculation.

**Quizzes:** At the end of each chapter there will be several problems assigned. I will choose 2 or 3 to place on a quiz.

**Final Exam:** The final exam will be comprehensive and will be given on the date listed in the final exam schedule. This exam will be worth 100 points. The final exam will be given on Tuesday, May 10, from 8am-10am.
