Course Description:

This course will be a continuation into the science of mental processes and behaviors – psychology. The course format will follow closely with the course text. It will communicate the nature and breadth of psychology, biological foundations of behavior, sensation and perception, memory and cognition, and social psychology.

- 1. Critical Thinking Skills—including creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis, evaluation and synthesis of information.
- 2. Communication Skills—including effective development, interpretation, and expression of ideas through written communication.
- 3. Empirical and Quantitative Skills—including the analysis of numerical data or observable facts resulting in informed conclusions.
- 4. Social Responsibility—including intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities.

Nature of Course:

This course has been planned as a fully in-person course for Spring 2023. The class will meet in-person in PY 101 all scheduled days unless otherwise notified. The course will utilize an assigned seating chart in order to aid in checking attendance quickly. Attendance will be checked every class. Students will not attend class if they are experiencing illness or any signs/symptoms of COVID-19, they will contact me via email regarding their condition. I will use D2L for posting syllabi, course communication, course schedule, quizzes, and gradebook. You should regularly check D2L and the email hosted via D2L for important course information. I also recommend downloading the Brightspace Pulse app in your smartphone's app store to help you keep track of assignments/dates. In the event of increased incidence and risk of COVID-19 that results in the university moving back to a shelter-in-place mode, the course instruction will transition to fully online. More instructions will be given at that time.

Course Participation:

Grading Procedures:

Quizzes: There will be a short quiz on some Fridays covering the chapter we most recently discussed in lecture. The questions for this quiz may come from your textbook or from in-class content. Each quiz will be worth 12.5 points. It will be unlocked for your completion via D2L on the date we have class and will be open for that date only.

Missed/Late Arrival Policy for Quizzes: Any quiz that is missed may be made up with instructor approval. There will be a 5 point PENALTY deducted from any quiz for which a student does not have an excused absence for date of quiz. There is no grade penalty for quizzes missed due to an excused absence. Exams: There will be a total of 3 exams throughout the semester. Each of the exams will consist of multiple-choice and/or short-answer questions from the textbook, possible additional readings, and class notes. Each exam will be worth 100 points. The exam will be in-person. You will be required to bring a scantron, blue book, and #2 pencil on those days.

There will be A LETTER GRADE PENALTY (10 points) deducted from any make-up exam for which a student does not have an excused absence for date of test. Research Participation:

It is important that students of scientific psychology learn firsthand something about the scientific nature of the discipline. Therefore, all students in PSYC 1103 and 2203 are required to participate in one of the following research-related exercises. No extra credit is given for research participation, but failure to complete the research requirement will result in a one letter grade reduction for the course. The deadline for completing the research requirement is April 21, 2023.

Participate in one or more approved psychology research projects totaling at least 90 minutes no later than April 21, 2023. Research opportunities will be announced throughout the semester in postings that appear on the psychology department's website at

OR

Complete a research ethics essay. Participating students will read academic writings addressing research ethics. Following this, students will complete a 3-4 page double-spaced, typed summary and review of the information they read. Tables, figures, pictures do not count toward the minimum page requirement. Essays must be submitted no later than April 21, 2023.
