Purpose: A select chorus of mixed voices dedicated to the performance of choral literature of all periods and styles. In this class we will learn choral techniques and vocal training that are necessary to be a professional level singer and educator.

Requirements: Students who audition and are accepted into the Midwestern Singers are required to:

- Attend all concerts, rehearsals, and extra rehearsals outside of class time.
- Work on music outside of rehearsals as necessary.
- Be musically prepared for all concerts, rehearsals, audition dates as scheduled.
- Come prepared for all rehearsals and concerts (i.e. bring music, pencil, water, etc.).

Attendance Policy: Students are required to be present and on time for all rehearsals, sectionals, and call times. Absences from either rehearsals, sectionals, or concerts is not permitted with the exception of excuses such as illness or family emergencies. Absences must be approved by Dr. Wininger, preferably with at least 24 hours' notice prior to the absence. Students are allowed three unexcused absences from rehearsal and three unexcused absences from sectionals before it begins to impact the final grade. Each subsequent unexcused absence beyond these will incur a penalty of one-half letter grade. Extra credit opportunities may be available, please inquire with Dr. Wininger.

Students are expected to adjust their personal schedules (i.e. jobs, appointments, interviews, etc.) in advance to meet the commitments of the choir. Students are subject to dismissal from the choir who have excessive unexcused absences and are unprepared to sing the music in a concert.

Grading Policy: Grades for Midwestern Singers will be based on:

- Attendance at rehearsals, sectionals, and concerts
- Attitude and contribution to the choir in a positive manner at all events
- 4 unexcused absences result in a grade of B; 6, a grade of C; 8, a grade of D; and 10 or more will result in an F.
- An unexcused concert absence will automatically result in a grade of F.

Sectionals

All sections are required to host one sectional per week for at least 30 minutes. Attendance will be figured towards your final grade. Please be flexible with your colleagues in scheduling when possible.

Regardless of these important legal considerations, it is my general policy to communicate with the students, not their parents even when a student has signed a consent form. College students are adults and are expected to behave accordingly.

Smoking/Tobacco Policy

Campus Carry

Effective August I, 2016, the Campus Carry law (Senate Bill II) allows those licensed individuals to carry a concealed handgun in buildings on public university campuses, except in locations the University establishes has prohibited. The new Constitutional Carry law does not change this process. Concealed carry still requires a License to Carry permit, and openly carrying handguns is not allowed on college campuses.
