Vocal lessons: One-hour private lesson Lesson time is arranged with the instructor.

Course Goals:

Student will develop a high standard of vocal performance.

Student will learn how to communicate effectively to others through the singing of literature.

Course Objectives:

Student will demonstrate improvement in the following areas:

- Coordinated vocal onset/attack
- Resonance balance
- Registration
- Sostenuto singing
- Breath Management
- Messa di voce
- Diction
- Rules of expressive singing
- Stage deportment

Textbooks:

The instructor will decide the best materials to use for each student throughout the term of study. Each student will be required to purchase music as needed.

Assignments, Grading, and Attendance Policy:

- Students will be assigned 3-5 songs per semester.
- Students are expected to attend their lesson times each week
- If a lesson must be missed, it is the student's responsibility to notify the teacher and accompanist

before the scheduled lesson time. Missed lessons will be made-up at the discretion of the instructor.

- Student will keep and maintain a practice log provided by instructor.

- Student will complete all assignments to the instructor's satisfaction.

The final grade will be determined by the voice jury at the end of the semester. Also, the student will be evaluated throughout the semester in regard to attendance, attitude, translations, and progress towards expressive vocal production. All assigned pieces must be jury ready or grade will be lowered.

Cell Phones:

The use of cell phones (for calls, messaging, or any other use) is not allowed in class at any time and constitutes grounds for dismissal from the class, with an absence designated for that day. Please be sure they are turned off and put away before class begins.

Academic Dishonesty

Plagiarism is (1) the use of source material of other persons (either published or unpublished, including the Internet) without following the accepted techniques of giving credit or (2) the submission for credit of work not the individual's to whom credit is given. If a student in the class appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. Smoking/Tobacco Policy

Alcohol and Drug Policy

To comply with the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989 and subsequent amendments, students and employees of Midwestern State are informed that strictly enforced policies are in place which prohibits the unlawful possession, use or distribution of any illicit drugs, including alcohol, on university property or as part of any university-sponsored activity. Campus Carry

Effective August 1, 2016, the Campus Carry law (Senate Bill 11) allows those licensed individuals to carry a concealed handgun in buildings on public university campuses, except in locations the University establishes has prohibited. The new Constitutional Carry law does not change this process. Concealed carry still requires a License to Carry permit, and openly carrying handguns is not allowed on college campuses. Inclement Weather Statement

Key decision-makers will monitor weather projections and communicate with local news agencies and WFISD leadership to make a delay or cancellation decision. Notification occurs through official campus channels and in communication with the local news networks. MSU channels include MSU Alert, MSU Safety app, Postmaster, website headers, MSU Police, and the Office of Marketing and Public Information. The timeline is as follows:

Inclement weather occurs during regular work/class day	3:30 PM	Day of inclement weather	Cancel classes/events after 5 PM
Overnight inclement weather expected	8 PM	Day before inclement weather	Close campus or delay opening
Delay called the day before but change to closure due to the extent of weather impact	6:15 AM	Day of delay	Close campus
No cancellation or delay decision made the night before	5:30 AM	Day after no decision made the night before	Close campus or delay opening
