• Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- **Mood Stabilizers:** Understand the indications, mechanisms of action, side effects, and contraindications of mood stabilizers, with a focus on Lithium and Divalproex sodium, and manage related complications like lithium toxicity.
- **Antipsychotic Medications:** Explore the evolution of antipsychotics, comparing first- and second-generation agents, and assess their impact on treating

disorders like schizophrenia and bipolar disorder, while staying updated on recent advancements.

- **ECT and TMS:** Compare the efficacy, safety, mechanisms of action, and patient experiences of ECT and TMS, including their accessibility, long-term effects, and ethical considerations in treating mental health conditions.
- **PMHNP Professional Pathways:** Outline the educational, certification, and licensure requirements for PMHNPs, understand the impact of scope of practice laws, and emphasize the importance of continuing education and staying informed on regulatory changes.
