0043 Course Requirements: Students in the NCBO are not given a grade but are given Credit or No Credit based on completion of course material. The goal is to increase student skills and assist with successful completion of ENGL 1143: Introduction to Critical Reading & Academic Writing and other courses. The lab provides feedback on assignments to allow a student to comprehend the material presented.

Learning lab: Required digital materials for this course are part of the Courseware Access and Affordability Program at MSU Texas. Students are charged for required course materials on their student account with the Business Office. Any students who wish to opt-out of the Program and purchase the required course materials on their own must do so by the date provided. Opt-out instructions are sent to students' official my.msutexas.edu email address after the first day of class. Please contact the MSU Bookstore jenny.denning@msutexas.edu if you have any questions about the opt-out process.

Dropping the Course: You are enrolled in both ENGL 0010 and 1143 (Q section), you may drop one course and remain enrolled in the other under the following condition: If you are taking a beginning or intermediate math course, you may drop ENGL 0010 from 17 October to 24 October, 2022, but no sooner in the semester. You may drop 1143 any time before the final drop date, 24 October 2022.

Course Progress and Credit: During the first week of classes, you should open the lab's home page and take the Path Builder tests to create your learning path. The amount of work in your learning path is determined by your skill level as determined by the tests. Then you need to work weekly to complete the tasks in your learning path. Your instructor will be watching your progress. If your progress is slow in the NCBO, your instructor will contact you through D2L email and/or your ENGL 1143 instructor. If you cease to progress in ENGL 0010, you will receive a no-credit for the NCBO

Midterm "Grades": In order to help students keep track of their progress toward course completion, I provide a Midterm Progress Report through Navigate. I will submit a report for all students, not just those in danger of not receiving credit for the NCBO. Midterm reports are not reported on the students' transcript; nor are they calculated in the cumulative GPA. They simply give you an idea of where you stand at the midpoint of the semester. Your progress will determine your midterm report.
