Examination of the ways in which people differ and how these differences can influence sport organizations. Major topics include age, race, mental and physical ability, gender, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, and social class.

Diversity & Inclusion Survey: **DUE Wednesday, September 1, 11:00 pm** (75 pts)

The survey has 15 items related to beliefs, attitudes, or comfort level associated with diversity and inclusion in the workplace.

Forms of Diversity Discussion Questions: DUE Wednesday, September 8, 11:00 pm (100 pts)

This assignment is comprised of 5 discussion questions related to forms of diversity and implications for professional practice.

Organization Examination: **DUE Wednesday, September 22, 11:00 pm** (40 pts)

This assignment asks you to select a specific sport, recreation, tourist, or leisure organization and examine its position on diversity and inclusion.

Inclusive Leadership and Practices Analysis: **DUE Wednesday, October 6, 11:00 pm** (50 pts)

This assignment involves an examination of how individuals, groups, and organizations are building partnerships in the community and promoting inclusiveness through affirmative practices and leadership in sport, recreation, and leisure services.

Comprehensive Overview: DUE Wednesday, October 13, 11:00 pm (80 pts)

The comprehensive overview consists of 5 discussion questions that address broad conceptual issues associated with diversity and inclusion in the broader context of society.
