## Week one overview Fall 2024

- Schedule and due dates for the Course assignments and the Laboratory Assignments are
  in the Read Me First folder on D2L. They appear in the Syllabus separately, at the end,
  and as stand-alone Schedule documents. You also have a calendar in this folder
  showing all due dates for course and lab assignments.
- As you are starting week one, please make sure you go through the entire "Read Me First" section first. There is a quiz due **Wednesday August 27**<sup>th</sup> covering the material in the Read Me First folder, including the syllabus.
- Read Chapters 1 and 2 in the textbook. During this week, you will be viewing 9 short (15 minutes or less) lecture videos that cover Chapters 1 and 2 in your textbook. This is the equivalent of three 50-minute face-to-face lectures. The videos comprise PowerPoint presentations with a voiceover lecture.
- As you watch the video lectures and read the book, you can have the weekly quiz review
  file for each chapter (in Word format) available. You can answer the questions weekly,
  as you view/read the material. This review is made directly from the quiz and test
  material and should serve to help you prepare effectively. If you can define all the
  vocabulary and answer all of the topical questions, you will be well prepared for each
  weekly quiz and each test.
- After you have watched the videos, read the chapter, and filled out the review, you will be ready for the content Quiz. There is a quiz available at the beginning of this and each succeeding week covering the weekly chapter(s); the week one quiz is due Tuesday September 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- This week you have the first Reading Assignment. During this course you will be reading
  five selections from four authors who write about the environment in popular literature,
  interspersed with Discussion Assignments. There is a specific assignment attached to
  each reading and to each Discussion. This week you will read "The First Morning" from
  Desert Solitaire by Edward Abbey (due Thursday September 4<sup>th</sup>).
- You have no lab assignment this week. Typically, you will have a lab assignment due on Wednesdays. Your first assignment starts next week and is due Wednesday September 10<sup>th</sup>.
